4-H Afterschool programs will be cancelled anytime a school district cancels all other afterschool programs due to weather or other reasons. This includes early dismissal and full day cancellations.



Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference June 22-25, 2015 **UW-Madison Campus**

Approximately 600 youth attend this educational event in Madison each summer. Participants take part in educational seminars and assemblies and meet people from across Wisconsin. They are encouraged to take what they learn and share it with others in their home community.

Qualifications:

- Be in 7th-10th grade at the time of selection
- Be a 4-H member or member of another Extension program
- Carry county approval through time of award trip.

Costs:

The registration cost for Wisconsin 4 H & Youth Conference is \$235 this year. The Federation of Taylor County 4-H will pay 75% of the registration fee and cover bus transportation to Madison. The delegate's portion of the cost is \$58.75.

Per the county trips policy, each delegate will need to submit two checks: one for the \$58.75 portion and one for \$176.25 which is a deposit. The second check will be destroyed following the conference providing no disciplinary problems arise. Checks need to be brought to the UW-Extension Office by **April 1** to reserve your spot.

Enrollment this year is through 4-H Online. Registration will be open from March 4-15, 2015. Informational packets including handbooks are being sent separately.

To go on a trip and receive support from the Leaders Federation, you must interview for all trips with the Leaders Federation a month before the trip deadline. You will need to call the UW-Extension office at 715-748-3327 ext. 4 or ext. 9 to place yourself on the agenda. Participants will need to write out two checks for their awarded trip. Both checks will be made payable to the Federation of Taylor County 4-H. The first check will be made payable for 1/4 of the cost of the trip. The second check will be made payable for 3/4 of the cost of the trip. This check will be in a locked safe until after the trip. After returning from the trip, if no disciplinary action has been taken towards your child, the check will be shredded.

Spring 2015 Shooting Sports **Certification Workshops**

To serve as a Shooting Sports Leader, 4-H leaders must complete the Youth Protection process, be at least 21 years old, and participate in at least one state-level 4-H Leader Training Shooting Sports certification in the discipline in which they are providing supervision. If an adult leader is not certified, he/she cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader being present.

Shooting Sports Certification workshops teach 4-H Leaders how to conduct safe, supervised shooting experiences for 4-H members. Leaders who have experience in safely handling archery equipment and/or firearms are encouraged to enroll in these certification workshops.

Federation of Taylor County 4-H Leaders Scholarship

REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

Federation of Taylor County 4-H Adopted January 6, 1994

- 1. All reimbursements are dependent on availability of funds (advance request <u>recommended</u>).
- 2. All events with total cost to Federation in excess of \$75.00 will <u>require</u> advanced written notice <u>mailed</u> to the Federation Treasurer, and be subject to #3 below. A prereimbursement form is required to be filled out advance and mailing it to the Federation Treasurer. A postreimbursement form will be also filled out after the event and returned to the Federation Treasurer within two months of the event.
- Events in excess of \$75.00 (cost to Federation) will be paid on a scale of 0-5, dependent on Executive Boards' judgment of the benefit to 4-H program or needed support of outstanding youth. To be decided at closest Executive Board or annual meeting.

0=0% 1=20% 2=40% 3=60% 4=80% 5=100%
4. The cost of gasoline plus an additional 50% of that cost will be the figure submitted as a reimbursement item. Mileage count will begin and end at local starting point.

- 5. All vouchers must be submitted to treasurer within two months of event, but no later than one week prior to the November Annual Meeting. A <u>brief</u> statement of benefit to the 4-H program must be written on the official voucher.
- All 4-H Rules and Behavior Expectations must be honored by the youth and chaperones or you will forfeit the right for reimbursement.
