Broadband and BEAD

I have been assigned to a sub-committee of the Taylor County Broadband Committee to work on the BEAD planning grant that Taylor County has received.

BEAD Local Planning Grant Program

Counties that have opted-in to the BEAD Local Planning Grant Program will need to submit a grant application and a placeholder budget to be used until a final budget is developed. This grant application and placeholder budget will be due on May 1, 2023.

By June 19, 2023, it will be expected that each grant signatory will have:

- 1. convened an initial planning group or provide documentation of meetings of an existing group.
- 2. began outreach to stakeholders in their community and/or region related to broadband planning.
- 3. identified a preliminary regional broadband vision and draft goals.
- 4. identified key barriers and opportunities related to Internet for All in their community and/or region.
- 5. and submitted a detailed budget by cost category.

FEED Webinar Series

Planning for a series of webinars for food entrepreneurs in collaboration with county educators, statewide specialists, and local experts. This effort is designed to equip food entrepreneurs with increased skills and knowledge for operating successful food business enterprises.

Outreach Survey

Cow-Calf Workshop

The March 18, 2023, cow calf workshop held in Ridgeland, WI was attended by 32 beef producers from Taylor, Polk, Barron, Chippewa, and St Croix counties. Extension Beef Outreach Specialist, Bill Halfman, and educator Sandy Stuttgen presented information about designing cattle handing facilities that improve handling efficiency and safety for the cattle and handlers during herd health events. Sandy also discussed establishing veterinary relationships to maintain access to prescription products and farm biosecurity. The goal for this program is to increase economic sustainability of WI beef producers regarding their cattle handling and health management practices. Evaluation data from this program is being summarized and will be reported.

Beef Producers

Twenty-eight beef producers including three youth participated in an on-farm grazing and fencing workshop that Sandy organized. She collaborated with the North Central WI Cattlemen's Association, the UW-Madison Extension Grazing Outreach Specialist and an area fencing professional to provide hands on instruction on fence and corral design, and spring pasture management. Producers from Taylor, Lincoln, Marathon, Ashland, and Price counties attended this workshop that was held on April 13, 2023.

MAMS 4-H Afterschool

Beginning in February, I have been presenting some 4-H programming at MAMS after school as a part of their Community Learning Center (CLC). Three sessions were scheduled for LEGO robotics. LEGO robotics is an exciting and engaging way to help youth learn about engineering and coding. After a brief introduction, the youth worked at their own pace and asked me for help as needed.





March and April have provided several youths the opportunity to learn to sew. Youth learned to thread the machine, sew straight lines and were able to make a pillowcase to take home with them. Sewing provides youth with an activity that helps with positive mental health and a skill that can last a lifetime. Youth in both of these afterschool programs were respectful and worked well together.

Partnerships

A new effort in partnership with the Taylor County Food Resource Group to develop a comprehensive guide detailing resources for accessing emergency, supplemental and locally grown food, and meal services. This guide is available in English and will be made available in Spanish next quarter. Several other partnerships have been identified and established within Taylor County: ADRC, First Baptist Food Pantry, Taylor County Human Services Economic Assistance, and Taylor County Commission on Aging.

Key Efforts

- Build support through collaboration for community-based food/nutrition and food security programs for SNAP-eligible (limited-income) populations.
- Provide helpful staff training, and needs-based programming and evaluation, which is fiscally responsible.
- Collaborate with nutrition educators and partner agencies to plan and implement interventions that improve healthy food practices and encourage practical healthy food and physical activity choices.
- Participate in FoodWise Nutrition Educator staff recruitment and lead local onboarding.
