

## **Static Exhibitor Updates**

## Here are some reminders to static exhibitors:

First of all, we are in desperate need of help in the grader shed. Please help by volunteering to supervise the static exhibits in the grader shed. (See link on page 5.)

**Foods:** Please make sure you include the recipe and full directions for ALL entries. If you choose to use one of the recipes from the 4-H literature or the uniform recipe list you do not need to include the recipe as long as you didn't change anything and you write 4-H literature or uniform recipe list on the tag. (I have a copy of all those recipes.) If you don't you will drop one placing. Do not use plastic wrap if at all possible. We have plates, baggies, and flip-top containers available for you to use. Be sure you have the right quantity and size for your entries. If you don't follow directions you will drop a placing. All breads should be from a full-sized loaf. 1/3 of the loaf should be entered and must include one end. Please attach the tags to the OUTSIDE of the baggie/container. (Be sure not to staple the bag shut.)

**Food Preservation:** Make sure you fill out the yellow tag that should have been included with your entry tags. If you do not have it filled out properly or use an unapproved canning method, you can/will be disqualified. Make sure your jars are clean and you remove the ring. FYI...processing time is not the time of day you canned it and the recipe source needs to be a current canning book, not a person. We encourage the use of the U.W. Extension literature or the Ball Blue Book.

Cake Decorating: ALL food, including decorated cakes, get thrown away promptly at 5:30 on Sunday. If you want pictures, take them before 5:30. Also, if you make a "fake" cake, please write down what you used for your base (styrofoam, rice krispies, etc.)

Fabric projects (knitting, crochet, home furnishings, etc.): Please pin your tag to the items. Tape does not stick very well.

## Continued reminders to static exhibitors:

**Photography:** Make sure your pictures and tag are securely fastened to your picture board. Also, DO NOT USE GLITTER!!! It makes a huge mess all over everything! Drawings, stickers, etc. are discouraged. The focus should be on the pictures. These are NOT scrapbook pages.

**Clothing:** ALL clothing items should be brought in on a hanger. We encourage you to use clothes pins or the hangers with clips so the clothing doesn't get bumped off. We do not have a lot of table space. Make sure you include the care label if required (see fair book/website). If you do not include the card with all the information required, you will drop a placing.

**Home Furnishings:** Be sure to include a description of the room (see fair book) the item will be used in. "It will keep me warm" does not describe the ROOM. You will drop a placing if the card is not there or you did not follow directions.

**Woodworking:** Make sure to write what your item is on the tag. Signs made by ironing on a saying is NOT woodworking unless you actually cut out, sanded, and finished the sign. Please do not glue bows, flowers, etc. to a woodworking project.

**Flowers/House Plants/Fruits/Vegetables:** Entries must be grown by the exhibitor, not purchased from a florist, at the farmer's market, etc. Flowers must be real, not artificial.

Fruits/Vegetables/Field Crops: Check the fairbook for quantities. Also read directions for length of tops or to include roots.

Houseplants: The age of the plant must be written on the tag or it drops one placing.

## **Static Exhibitor Updates**

### Continued reminders to static exhibitors:

**Lego/Scale Models:** Please put these on a sturdy surface such as a thin board, small cookie sheet, etc., so the project can be moved easily without it breaking. Using a glass/plexiglass case is encouraged. The board/hard surface should not be more than 1" bigger all the way around than the base of the project. If bringing a **large scale model project**, please email the fair or let Dawn Rudolph or Kathy Schumacher know so they can plan accordingly.

**Jewelry:** Please display items in such a way that they aren't easily lost or taken. This may be pinning them to foam, covered styrofoam or cardboard, etc. and placing them in a clear plastic baggie. Loose items laying on the table can easily be slipped into a pocket.
