

Dear 4-H Families and Friends:



Thanks to all of our 4-H youth members and adult volunteers who made the 22-23 4-H year a great one in Taylor County with lots of activities, learning and growth. We are working hard to create new, fun, engaging learning activities for a meaningful 4-H experience in the 2023-24 4-H year.

4-H is open enrollment which means people can enroll throughout the year. However, it helps our clubs and our office to know who is going to be involved. Last year we ended the 4-H year with 179 4-H youth members in Taylor County and 38 adult volunteers. Currently, we are at 100 4-H youth members and 25 adult volunteers. If you haven't enrolled yet, please do so. Let's keep increasing these numbers so other youth can benefit from 4-H! Remember youth need to enroll in 4-H by March 1 and attend at least 3 club meetings by summer to be qualified to exhibit at the Taylor County Fair.

Adult volunteers, we need your help to provide project meetings for our youth to help them learn. We will soon be sending out information about how many youth are enrolled in each project. Please register to be a 4-H volunteer and be thinking about how you can share your skills with our youth.

The 4-H Record Book is a summary of what youth have done throughout the year. The goal of 4-H is to build life skills of the youth members and goal setting and reflection are tools that help youth learn. Educational Travel Experience Scholarship applications and interviews provide an opportunity for youth to earn money to help pay for a 4-H Educational Travel Experience for the coming year and learn valuable interviewing skills. Annual Financial Reports ensure that our 4-H clubs and groups are using the funds in an appropriate manner to support 4-H activities and programs throughout the year.



4-H youth and Volunteers enroll through 4-H Online beginning September 1. As of October 25, we have 85 youth and 21 volunteers enrolled for the 2023-24 4-H year. October 1-7 was National 4-H week - Taylor County 4-H was highlighted in radio spots on K99, many social media posts, window decorations in local businesses, displays in public libraries, and many of our clubs had their first club meeting of the new 4-H year. Most clubs elected their new officers for the 2023-2024 4-H year and plan for the year including: service, education, fundraising and fun. All of this information is included in the Club Charters due November 1. Planning and organizing is a great life skill that 4-H members learn during these meetings.

The beginning of the 4-H year is a great time to begin your record book. Record books are required for youth applying for scholarships, educational travel experiences, and 4-H Key Awards. Not planning to go on a travel experience? Do a record book anyways! Record books help you set goals for yourself and keep track of all the things you are accomplishing in 4-H. Record books are typically due the 1st week in September.

4-H Program



4-H members need the support and encouragement of their family. Parents and other family members can contribute in many ways to the 4-H program. They may help members:

- Determine project goals
- Obtain necessary project supplies
- Carry out work at home
- Maintain records
- Evaluate project work
- Attend club meetings
- Participate in countywide events
- Choose to become a 4-H volunteer

Project Information



What Are Project Meetings?

A project meeting is defined as a scheduled meeting which is planned, organized, coordinated, and /or taught by a certified 4-H volunteer with the purpose of learning new project skills or mastering project knowledge which will assist the 4-H member enrolled in 4-H project work.

Routine tasks associated with project work should not be considered as an appropriate substitute for project meeting attendance. For example, feeding a pet cat daily should not be considered a project meeting. As the purpose of the 4-H program is one of education and not competition, project meetings should provide an opportunity to develop new skills. Therefore, project meeting focus should be on skill development and not simply on fair exhibit completion and competition. For example, if a 4-H member baked purple ribbon cookies at a project meeting last year and returned to bake the same recipe this year, this activity would be defined as project work and not a project meeting as no new skills were developed.

4-H Terminology continued....

Club Leader—an adult volunteer who is responsible for the general operation and coordination of the club.

Project Leader—work with individual members, or a group of youth, in a project area to support and guide their learning.

Federation—group of countywide volunteers who set policies, coordinates countywide activities, and plan and promote the county 4-H program.

- 4. Only seniors in a Wisconsin high school are eligible to apply.

Equity Cooperative Livestock Scholarship

Annually, Equity Cooperative Livestock Sales Association offers ten \$1,250 4-year or university scholarships and four \$1,000 technical college scholarships. Students applying must have completed two or more semesters at an accredited college or university, or at least one semester at a technical college. They must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above, on a 4.0 scale. Either the student, their parent (s) or grandparent(s) must be an active member or employee of Equity Cooperative Livestock Sales Association. Go to www.equitycoop.com to see eligibility requirements. Entries must be completed by November 30, 2023, to be considered.


