Happy Holiday Season 4-H Families,

Thanks to all of our 4-H youth members and adult volunteers who made the 23-24 4-H year a great one in Taylor County with lots of activities, learning, and growth. We are working hard to create new, fun, engaging learning activities for a meaningful 4-H experience in the 2024-25 4-H year.

4-H is open enrollment which means people can enroll throughout the year. However, it helps our clubs and our office to know who is going to be involved. Last year we ended the 4-H year with 169 4-H youth members in Taylor County and 28 adult volunteers. Currently, we are at 64 4-H youth members and 4 adult volunteers (15 more volunteers once they complete the trainings and/or background check). If you haven't enrolled yet, please do so. Let's keep increasing these numbers so other youth can benefit from 4-H! Remember youth need to enroll in 4-H by March 1 and attend at least 3 club meetings by summer to be qualified to exhibit at the Taylor County Fair.

Adult volunteers, we need your help to provide project meetings for our youth to help them learn. We will soon be sending out information about how many youth are enrolled in each project. Please register to be a 4-H volunteer and be thinking about how you can share your skills with our youth.

4-H is a Family Program

- 4-H members need the support and encouragement of their family. Parents and other family members can contribute in many ways to the 4-H program. They may help members:
- Determine project goals
- Obtain necessary project supplies
- Carry out work at home
- Maintain records
- Evaluate project work
- Attend club meetings
- Participate in countywide events
- Choose to become a 4-H volunteer

Some helpful advice from 4-H families to new 4-H families:

- Read the Taylor County 4-H Newsletter and 4-H Email Blasts
- Follow Taylor County 4-H on Facebook
- Be on time for important 4-H deadlines
- Bring your family calendar to your 4-H meeting
- Take lots of pictures of your children during 4-H activities
- If you have questions, reach out to your club leader, other 4-H families, or the county 4- H Educator

4-H Educator—4-H staff that manages the county 4-H program and provides outreach programming to non 4-H youth.

4-H Year—October to September

Cloverbud—4-H member in grades K-2nd grade

Club Meeting—monthly meeting for 4-H members



What Are Project Meetings?

A project meeting is defined as a scheduled meeting which is planned, organized, coordinated, and /or taught by a certified 4-H volunteer with the purpose of learning new project skills or mastering project knowledge which will assist the 4-H member enrolled in 4-H project work.

Routine tasks associated with project work should not be considered as an appropriate substitute for project meeting attendance. For example, feeding a pet cat daily should not be considered a project meeting. As the purpose of the 4-H program is one of education and not competition, project meetings should provide an opportunity to develop new skills. Therefore, project meeting focus should be on skill development and not simply on fair exhibit completion and competition. For example, if a 4-H member baked purple ribbon cookies at a project meeting last year and returned to bake the same recipe this year, this activity would be defined as project work and not a project meeting as no new skills were developed.

4-H Terminology continued....

Club Leader—an adult volunteer who is responsible for the general operation and coordination of the club.

Project Leader—work with individual members, or a group of youth, in a project area to support and guide their learning.

Federation—group of countywide volunteers who set policies, coordinates countywide activities, and plan and promote the county 4-H program.

Scholarship Requirements

- 1. All applicants must possess a sincere interest in the pork industry.
- 2. All applicants must pursue a post high school education, i.e. college, vocational school, short course, etc.
- All applicants are required to fill out and return the form, found at the above link, no later than DECEMBER 1, 2024
- 4. Only seniors in a Wisconsin high school are eligible to apply.


Equity Cooperative Livestock Scholarship

Annually, Equity Cooperative Livestock Sales Association offers ten \$1,250 4-year or university scholarships and four \$1,000 technical college scholarships. Students applying must have completed two or more semesters at an accredited college or university, or at least one semester at a technical college. They must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above, on a 4.0 scale. Either the student, their parent (s) or grandparent(s) must be an active member or employee of Equity Cooperative Livestock Sales Association. Go to www.equitycoop.com to see eligibility requirements. Entries must be completed by November 30, 2024, to be considered.

This Hall of Fame is established to recognize 4-H volunteers, financial supporters, staff, and pioneers who made major contributions to the 4-H movement at the local, state, and national levels. The candidates represent 4-H in the broadest sense - they may be 4-H volunteers, financial supporters, UW—Madison Division of Extension professionals, or staff employees who had an impact on the lives of children, their community, or state through significant contributions of time, energy, or financial resource to 4-H and its members.

Any group or individual is eligible to submit a nomination for consideration.

All 2025 nominations must be submitted electronically to Amanda Lacey at <u>amanda.lacey@wisc.edu</u> no later than January 15, 2025. Complete nominations include a:

- 1. Nomination cover page
- 2. Nomination signature page
- One-page Microsoft Word document outlining the nominee's qualifications based on the 4-H Hall of Fame criteria
- 4. Digital head and shoulder photograph and
- 5. Brief (no more than 250 words) biography.

4-H Volunteer Enrollment Process

Anyone who is at least 18 years old by September 1 can apply to become Wisconsin 4-H volunteer as long as they are not enrolled as a high school student.

Individuals cannot be enrolled as both a Wisconsin 4-H member and a Wisconsin 4-H volunteer. Once accepted as a Wisconsin 4-H volunteer, the individual is no longer eligible for Wisconsin 4-H membership.

All 4-H programs and activities must be supervised by a staff member or an approved 4-H volunteer, 18 years of age or older, who has completed all the following steps:

Step 1: Enroll in <u>4HOnline</u> including agreeing to the <u>Division of</u> <u>Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectations</u>.

• Step 2: Complete Criminal Background Check* (information will be sent via email to all new potential volunteers once a person has enrolled)

- Step 3: Complete Volunteer Trainings:
- UW Madison <u>Supporting You</u>, <u>Supporting Youth Training</u> ***
- Division of Extension Grow Green Training**
- Division of Extension Building Safe Spaces Training ***
- Volunteers serving as a chaperone will need to complete the <u>Supporting Youth Mental Health Training</u>

*A background records check for arrest and conviction records will be completed every two (2) years for continuing 4-H volunteer leaders.
