




NEW for 2025: A new United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) rule requires that official ID tags newly applied to cattle on or after November 5, 2024, must have both a visual and electronic component. The only official tags that currently meet these requirements are 840 RFID tags.



DNA supplies are NOW available for purchase!

All animal entries in the market and non-registered breeding stock shows of the Junior, Beef, Goat, Sheep and Swine Divisions of the 2025 Wisconsin State Fair must have 840 ear tag identification and DNA samples submitted to Wisconsin State Fair or an approved County Fair.



OHIO 4-H CLOVERBUDS CLICK AND DO ACTIVITY

CREATE A PET

Original lesson from the Big Book of 4-H Cloverbud Activities. Adapted by Christy Millhouse, 4-H Educator.

Background

Pets are an important part of many homes. This lesson allows Cloverbuds to be creative and create a pet that they might like to have. It also gives them a chance to think about the things that pets need to thrive.

 $\underline{\textbf{Materials Needed:}} \ \, \textbf{Items such as Newspaper, Shoes boxes, toilet or paper}$ towel rolls, egg cartons, Milk Jug, Yarn, Construction paper, Paper Plates, Pom Poms, Felt, Google Eyes, Scissors, Glue, Masking tape.



Activity

- 1. Tell the Cloverbuds they are going to use their imaginations to create an imaginary pet. Have the youth decide how many legs, tails, or even heads that the animal will have
- $2. \quad Using the materials you provide, help the Cloverbuds create their pets. They can roll newspaper into shapes to make a personal content of the content$ body or use the toilet paper rolls or egg cartons. Encourage them to be creative and use the materials provided.
- 3. While the Cloverbuds are working, ask them to think of a name for their pet. Remind them that pets need responsible owners to provide for their needs like grooming, feeding or vet visits.
- 4. Have a showcase for the created pets. Allow Cloverbuds to share the details fo their pets name, where they live, what they like to eat etc.

<u>Application</u>

Ask the Cloverbuds to make something for a pet. Maybe a kitten would like a special box to play in or a dog would like a toy.
