Dear 4-H Families and Friends:

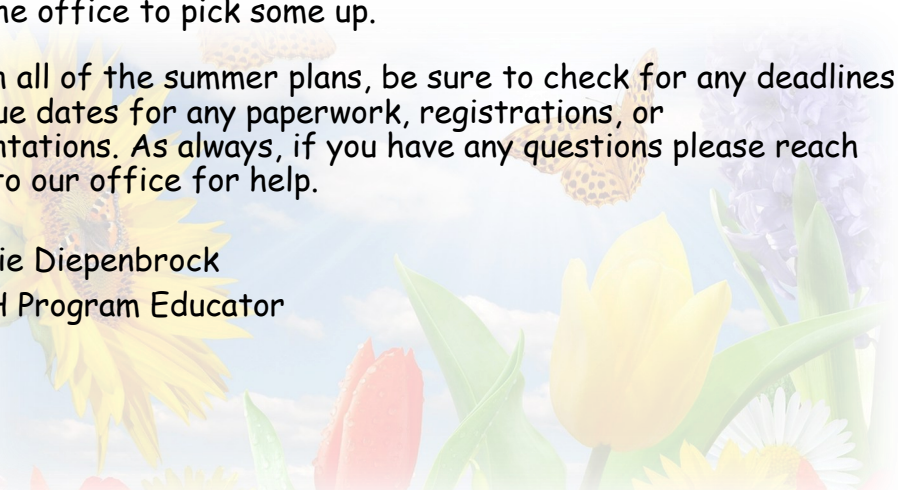

Taylor County Fair 2026 Updates as of April

Work Day has been set up for **July 8th from 10-2 and 5-8.**

Planning on doing the billboard competition again this year the same as we had last year.

Horse rules have been updated.

Also added that protective footwear is required when handling **ANY** large animal or in stalls.

Change to when barn decorations can be put up. The rule has changed to start decorations at 2:00p.m. the Sunday prior to the fair and must be in place by 11:30 a.m. on exhibit entry day. **Barn decorations can not be removed until 5:30 p.m. on release day.**

Scratches and Withdrawals Exhibitors who have officially entered an animal by the deadline may withdraw (scratch) their entry without penalty, provided notification is received by **midnight on the Friday preceding the Fair.**

Penalties for Late Scratches:

- **First Offense:** A fine of **\$25 per head** will be assessed. This must be paid in cash to the Fair Office by the conclusion of the current Fair. Failure to settle the fine will result in a suspension from the following year's event.
- **Second Offense:** A fine of **\$50 per head** and a mandatory one-year suspension from the following year's Fair.
- **Third Offense:** A permanent and indefinite ban from all future Fair participation.

Medical Exemptions: Fines and penalties will be waived only upon the presentation of a valid **Veterinary Certificate** or a certified veterinary form documenting illness or injury. Documentation must be submitted directly to the Fair Office to validate the exemption.

Stall Management: The reallocation of pens or stalls resulting from scratched entries remains at the sole discretion of the Department Superintendents.

The penalty will be assessed to the responsible party. **All premium payments will be withheld until the penalty has been settled in full.**

Nature Rubbings

Living things all have texture. By making nature rubbings you can see things you may not have otherwise noticed. When you make a rubbing of a leaf, the veins, stem and shape stand out. You can also compare the texture of items by making rubbings of them.

Let's observe nature!

Materials: Newspaper
Crayons (With Paper Peeled Off)
Fresh Leaves, Wild Flowers, Weeds, Grasses, Twigs or Reeds
White Paper



Procedure:

1. Go on a nature walk and collect some leaves, wild flowers, weeds, grasses, twigs or reeds.
2. Spread newspaper onto the work area.
3. Place your findings onto the newspaper.
4. Place the paper on top of the leaves or wildflowers you would like to make rubbings of.
5. Hold the crayon sideways and rub over the objects.
6. Watch the leaves and wildflowers appear as you rub the crayon over them.
7. Try making different patterns by arranging the materials in rows or circles.
8. Now, let's go outside with our paper and crayon and make rubbings from surfaces such as brick walls, tree trunks or anything else with texture!
